Morden - Little League National tournament winners 2001

The 25th National Tournament was held at a Nationwide Football League groundfor the first time this year. Brisbane Road in East London, home of Third Division Leyton Orient, was the venue for a match which lived up to all expectations.

In the end it was Morden's strength, experience and sharper shooting skills which proved too much for a gallent New Addington side.

With just 10 minutes of the first half played, Morden's Harry Bayliss picked up a long up-field pass, took a few paces, and drilled an unstoppable shost past the stranded goalkeeper and into the near corner.

New Addington came back almost immediately with Scott Smith's powerful shot blocked by Christopher Beard. Morden though kept the upper hand with the more strident moves and Bayliss again combined with David Francis only to be foiled by the active Morden keeper.

Morden's keeper Kerry Wotten was kept busy at the other end by Charlie Stagg but the New Addington attack could not make their chances count, a free kick towards the end of the half was met powerfully in the air but the header was kept

out by the agile Wotton. In the meantime, Morden had several goals disallowed, New Addington's Aaron Leacock making some splendid covering tackles.

After the break, New Addington came close to levelling the scores. A good move on the right wing in the 59th minute found Luke Spiknell whose deft header provided a chance for Danny Pearcey who shot into the side netting.

As Lewis Clark excelled in defence, Morden put the game beyond reach with just 7 minutes left on the clock. Francis was released down the left cutting in to score with a crisp shot.

Dean Wells in the New Addington goal kept he game alive with a superb display, saving brilliantly at the feet of two inrushing Morden forwards and making arguably the best save of the match from a powerful left wing cross-shot.

2-0 it ended, Morden the deserved victors. But it was no push over and New Addington should be congratulated for making this a match to remember.

Well done to both teams. A credit to the game and sure to be strong contenders both this time next year.

The Kingston Little league 7-A-Side Cup Final Day was held on Saturday 28th April 2001 on Latchmere Recreation Ground.

Because rain had prevented play on three Saturday's prior to the Cup Final Day it was not until Thursday 26th April that the final make up of the Quarterfinals were known.

The final Group games saw Maroons defeat a much-improved Light Blue side 2 - 1 to determine who was the winner and runner-up respectively in Group 3 and in the other game Oranges defeated Blue Hoops 3 - 2. This meant that Oranges secured their Quarter-final place from Group 4.

Despite heavy rain on Friday evening, Saturday morning started off bright and although all games were played on rain-affected pitches and it threatened to rain heavily again during the morning, the competition was finally concluded. There was some excellent football throughout the morning.

Quarter-Finals.

In the first Quarter-final games there were some close results. Whites v Dark Blues(The Scalp Hunters). This was a game that either side could have won and Blues' Joseph Stafford was unfortunate to see his flick over the Whites Goalkeeper cleared off the line in the last minute of normal play. In the first half of extra time Jonathan Ewing, the Dark Blues Goalkeeper was

desperately unlucky to concede the goal that gave Whites their victory after making a tremendous save from Josh Osborn, who was then able to follow up after the clearance rebounded at his feet. 1-0 the final score.

In another excellent game between Maroons and Oranges, an early lead by Maroons was held until the last 5 minutes when two goals by Oranges meant that they had booked their place in the Semi-Final with a 2 - 1 victory.

In the other quarter-final games Greens were winners over Ambers, the final result 1 - 0.

In the match between Yellow Tigers and Light Blues it was always anticipated that the result would go in favour of the Yellow Tigers. Despite spirited play from Light Blues the Yellows went 3 goals up before a consolation goal for Light Blues late in the second half.

Friendlies

As is normal the Quarter-Finals were followed by a number of friendly games between the losers of each of the Groups in these games Blue Hoops defeated Reds 2 - 0 and Red Hoops, who had missed out on a Quarter-Final place on goal difference defeated Stripes 2 - 1.

Semi-Finals

The match between White's and Yellow's went to extra time. Despite coming under pressure in normal play from a determined White's team battling to gain that final place, Yellow Tigers were able to hold on and take the game into extra time, Yellow's eventually winning 2 - 0.

The other Semi-Final between Green and Orange's was a pulsating game, which was eventually won by Oranges 1 - 0 with a great goal scored by Oliver Futcher.

Losers from the Quarterfinals then played a number of friendlies against the winners and losers of earlier Friendly games.

Final

The final between Oranges and Yellows was a repeat of the December 2000 final and Yellow Tigers were determined to take revenge for that match, which Oranges had won. Once again this was first class game that could have gone either way. Yellow Tigers scored an early goal through Kristian Dance. They held this lead well into the second half when Oranges scored a great equaliser by Michael Steward. Both sides had chances to finish the game but neither side could produce a goal and again extra time had to be played.

Yellow Tigers scored two goals in the first half of extra time, the first from Joshua Ayres and the second from Tom Palgrave. The game seemed all but over when Jack Whitehouse scored a second goal for Oranges with a minute left to play but they were unable to produce a third goal that would have taken the game to penalties. The final result being 3 - 2 to the Yellow Tigers.

Both sides played exceptionally well and it would be difficult to pick any one player as 'man of the match' but special mention should be made of Heather Offord for Oranges and Natasha James for Yellow Tigers they have both had excellent seasons in defence for their respective teams and will hopefully inspire other girls to play in Little League.
